

## Presumptive Law Coverage for Cancer

State	Cancer Language
<a href="#"><u>Alabama</u></a>	Alabaman exposed to a known carcinogen which is reasonably linked to the disabling cancer
<a href="#"><u>Alaska</u></a>	brain, malignant melanoma, leukemia, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, bladder, ureter, kidney
<a href="#"><u>Arizona</u></a>	brain, bladder, rectal, colon, lymphoma, leukemia, adenocarcinoma or mesothelioma
<a href="#"><u>California</u></a>	demonstrate he or she was exposed to a known carcinogen as defined by the IARC
<a href="#"><u>Colorado</u></a>	cancer of the brain, skin, digestive system, hematological system, or genitourinary system
<a href="#"><u>Connecticut</u></a>	Kahler's Disease, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, and prostate or testicular cancer
<a href="#"><u>Illinois</u></a>	cancer involved must be a type which may be caused by exposure to heat, radiation or a known carcinogen as defined by the IARC
<a href="#"><u>Indiana</u></a>	cancer that is caused by a known carcinogen to which an individual is at risk for occupational exposure
<a href="#"><u>Iowa</u></a>	prostate cancer, primary brain cancer, breast cancer, ovarian cancer, cervical cancer, uterine cancer, malignant melanoma, leukemia, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, bladder cancer, colorectal cancer, multiple myeloma, testicular cancer, and kidney cancer
<a href="#"><u>Kansas</u></a>	type of cancer which may, in general, result from exposure to heat, radiation or a known carcinogen
<a href="#"><u>Louisiana</u></a>	bladder, brain, colon, liver, pancreas, skin, kidney, gastrointestinal tract, leukemia, lymphoma, multiple myeloma
<a href="#"><u>Maine</u></a>	kidney, prostate, breast, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, testicular, colon, brain, bladder, leukemia or multiply myeloma
<a href="#"><u>Maryland</u></a>	has leukemia or pancreatic, prostate, rectal, or throat cancer that is caused by contact with a toxic substance
<a href="#"><u>Massachusetts</u></a>	cancer affecting the skin or the central nervous, lymphatic, digestive, hematalogical, urinary, skeletal, oral or prostate systems, lung or respiratory tract
<a href="#"><u>Minnesota</u></a>	cancer of a type caused by exposure to heat, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen, as defined by the IARC
<a href="#"><u>Missouri</u></a>	cancer affecting the skin or the central nervous, lymphatic, digestive, hematological, urinary, skeletal, oral, breast, testicular, genitourinary, liver or prostate systems, as well as any condition of cancer which may result from exposure to heat or radiation or to a known or suspected carcinogen as determined by the International Agency for Research on Cancer
<a href="#"><u>Nebraska</u></a>	cancer affecting the skin or the central nervous, lymphatic, digestive, hematological, urinary, skeletal, oral, or prostate systems
<a href="#"><u>Nevada</u></a>	exposed to a known carcinogen as defined by the IARC
<a href="#"><u>New Hampshire</u></a>	cancer involved must be a type which may be caused by exposure to heat, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen as defined by the IARC
<a href="#"><u>New Mexico</u></a>	brain, bladder, kidney, colorectal, non-hodgkins lymphoma, leukemia, ureter, testicular, breast, esophageal, multiple myeloma
<a href="#"><u>New York</u></a>	cancer affecting the lymphatic, digestive, hematological, urinary, neurological, breast, reproductive, or prostate systems
<a href="#"><u>North Dakota</u></a>	cancer is one which arises due to exposure to smoke, fumes, or carcinogenic, poisonous, toxic, or chemical substances
<a href="#"><u>Oklahoma</u></a>	existence of any cancer which was not revealed by the physical examination passed by the member upon entry into the department
<a href="#"><u>Oregon</u></a>	brain cancer, colon cancer, stomach cancer, testicular cancer, prostate cancer, multiple myeloma, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, cancer of the throat or mouth, rectal cancer, breast cancer or leukemia
<a href="#"><u>Pennsylvania</u></a>	cancer suffered by a firefighter... who can establish direct exposure to a carcinogen
<a href="#"><u>Rhode Island</u></a>	disabling occupational cancer which develops as a result of the inhalation of noxious fumes or poisonous gases

<b><u>South Dakota</u></b>	impairment of health caused by cancer
<b><u>Tennessee</u></b>	any impairment of health of such fire fighter caused by disease or cancer resulting in hospitalization, medical treatment or any disability
<b><u>Texas</u></b>	cancer that may be caused by exposure to heat, smoke, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen as determined by the IARC
<b><u>Vermont</u></b>	cancer limited to leukemia, lymphoma, or multiple myeloma, and cancers originating in the bladder, brain, colon, gastrointestinal tract, kidney, liver, pancreas, skin, or testicles.
<b><u>Virginia</u></b>	Leukemia or pancreatic, prostate, rectal, throat, ovarian or breast
<b><u>Washington</u></b>	brain cancer, malignant melanoma, leukemia, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, bladder cancer, ureter cancer, and kidney cancer
<b><u>Wisconsin</u></b>	skin, breasts, central nervous system or lymphatic, digestive, hematological, urinary, skeletal, oral or reproductive systems
